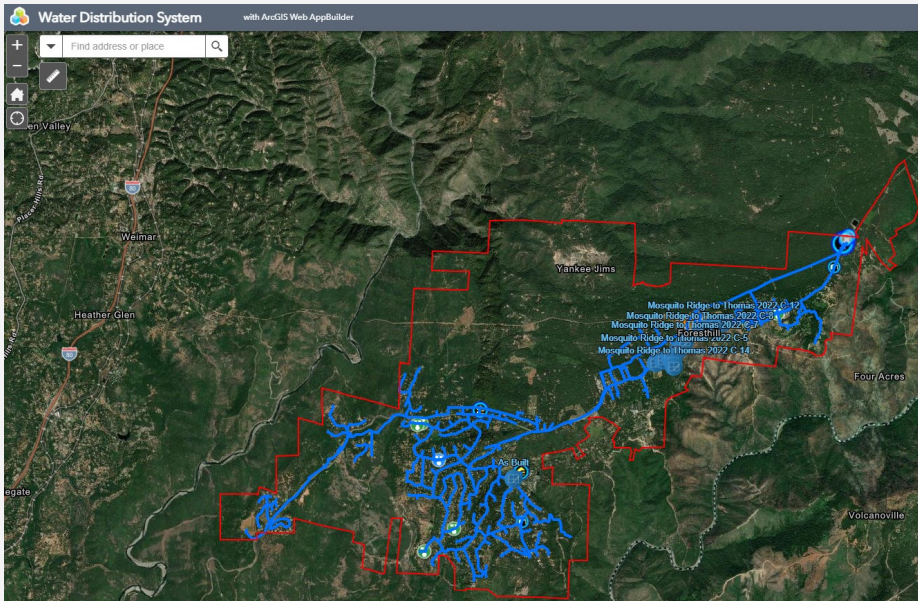

Per- and Polyfluoroalkyl Substances (PFAS)



In April 2024, the United States Environmental Protection Agency issued a first-ever national legally enforced drinking water standard to protect communities from exposure to harmful PFAS. The rule will reduce PFAS exposure for approximately 100 million people. Public water systems must monitor for these PFAS and have three years to complete initial monitoring by 2027. Foresthill is proud to share that your water meets or surpasses all current state and federal drinking water standards for public health and safety. Your drinking water will continue to be tested regularly to ensure it's safe to drink!
